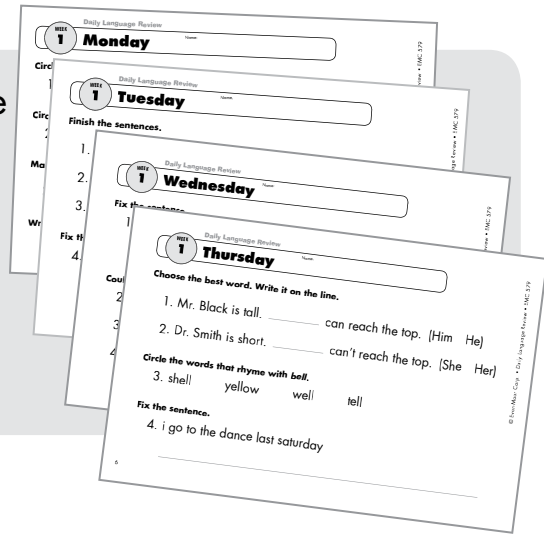


# How to Use *Daily Language Review*

Each weekly unit provides daily assessment activities.

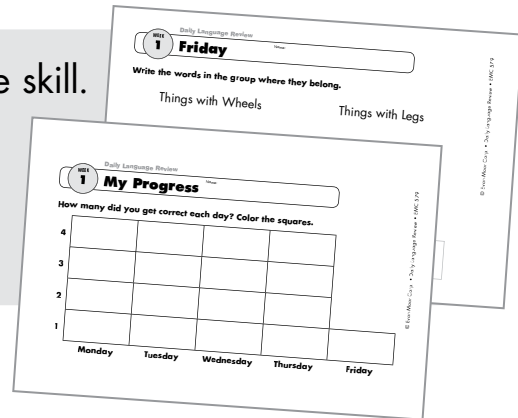
## Monday through Thursday

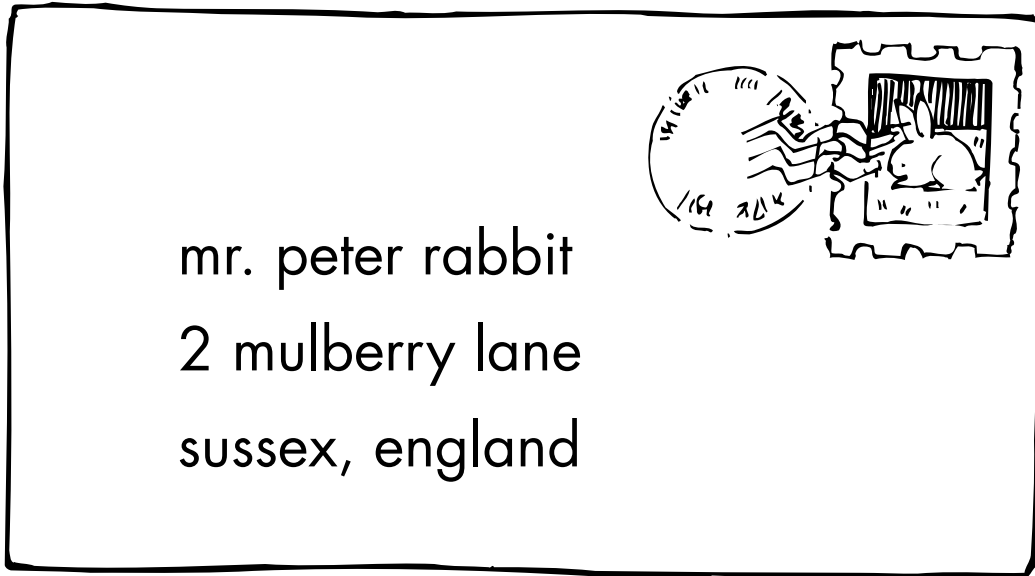
