A guide's qualifications can be categorized into one or more specialized classifications. To qualify as a specialist, an individual must meet the necessary requirements to lead specific types of activities. These classifications include: * Specialized Hunting: involves guiding hunting and trapping activities, including overnight camping trips. * Specialized Fishing: focuses on guiding fishing activities, including overnight camping on inland waters. * Specialized Recreational: encompasses boating, snowmobiling, and camping activities. * Specialized Sea-Kayaking: requires qualifications to guide sea-kayaking activities on the state's territorial seas and tributaries. * Specialized Tide-Water Fishing: involves guiding sport fishing activities on the state's territorial seas and tributaries. In addition to these classifications, a Master certification can be obtained by demonstrating experience in one or more specialized classifications that exceeds the minimum requirements for licensing as a guide. To qualify for Master Guide certification, an individual must: * Have been licensed as a Maine guide in the relevant specialization(s) for at least 10 years. * Document a minimum of 5 years of professional experience in the specialized classification(s), with a minimum of 80 hours spent guiding per calendar year. Each hour worked in a calendar year earns one year of credit towards the total. Guidelines for Maine Guide License Application Applicants must provide an affidavit detailing their guiding experience to be considered for a Master Guide license. The affidavit should include specific duties, responsibilities, and time spent on guiding activities. Experience will be credited on an hour-for-hour basis. To qualify for the Master Guide certification, applicants must meet the requirements outlined in Chapter 24.05(B)(1)(a) and (b). Once the Department receives an approved affidavit, they will validate the applicant's license with a certification that confirms their eligibility to work as a Master Guide. The certification remains valid until the guide's license is renewed within one year of expiration. However, if any information in the affidavit is found to be false, it can lead to revocation of the Master Guide certification. Maine Guides must demonstrate proficiency in various skills, including map and compass navigation, resolving life-threatening incidents, and extensive knowledge of Maine's hunting, fishing, and recreational laws. They must also pass a written and oral exam, scoring 70% or better, with classes offered in Augusta at the IF&W facility or nearby state offices. Applicants are required to hold current American Red Cross standard first-aid certification and pay a \$100 testing fee for each classification requested. A non-refundable fee applies if an applicant fails the test, with one re-examination allowed before another application fee is assessed. First-time applicants and renewals must also undergo a criminal history background check, including fingerprinting through Identogo. The State Bureau of Investigation sets the fee for this process, approximately \$55. Oral Exam Process: 1. Map and Compass Skills 2. Catastrophic Event/Lost Person Scenario 3. General Information & Skills - Laws, species identification, client care, weather, ethics, safety, demonstration of skills Candidates must be familiar with map features, symbology, terminology, scale, etc., and determine bearings and distances for several lines of travel on the provided map. The oral exam consists of three parts: scenario-based, general knowledge, and demonstration of skills, which tests the candidate's ability to react in emergency situations and prioritize treatment. The written exam is a 100-question True/False, Multiple Choice test covering topics such as bag limits, boating terms, safety, rules and regulations, camping, wildlife facts and habits, canoeing, hunting/fishing equipment, trapping, ATV/Snowmobile, and others. A guide's license is valid for 5 years, with a renewal fee of \$135.00. Required documents for renewal include an updated criminal history background check, administered through Identogo, and proof of first aid certification for most applicants. However, exceptions apply to Whitewater guides. The program includes professional instruction, practice tests, and study materials, such as the 150 Page Maine Guide Handbook and a Map & Compass Study Guide. Specialized Recreational Classification Explained A person with this classification can guide watercraft, all-terrain vehicles, snowmobiling, and camping activities. It also qualifies them to guide paddlesports on inland waters as defined in DIFW Rule 24.02 E. Additionally, it allows people to participate in sea-kayaking activities, including overnight camping trips. Specialized Sea-Kayaking Classification This classification enables individuals to guide sea-kayaking and paddlesports on the State's territorial seas and tributaries up to the head of tide and out to the three-mile limit. It includes overnight camping trips with those activities. Specialized Tide-Water Fishing Classification This license allows people to guide sport fishing activities on the State's territorial seas and tributaries, including overnight camping trips. Key Notes A valid U.S. Coast Guard license is required for operating a motorboat as part of guided hunting and fishing activities. Master certification means exceeding minimum requirements to be licensed in a Specialized classification. To obtain Master Guide certification, applicants must have been licensed as a guide in the desired classification for ten years and completed five years of professional experience. The applicant must submit an affidavit with their application, estimating the time spent guiding activities and crediting experience on an hour-for-hour basis. Upon meeting qualifications outlined in Chapter 24.05(B)(1)(a) and (b), the Department validates the license certification. The certification remains valid as long as the guide's license is renewed within a year of expiration. To initiate the Criminal History Records Check (CHRC) process for a first-time applicant, one must engage in activities such as hunting, fishing, sea-kayaking, or tide-waving. This can be done through registering with Identogo and having fingerprints taken electronically at a designated records check center across the state. The procedure commences by visiting the provided link, selecting "Schedule a New Appointment," and then choosing "Maine Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Guide License" from the dropdown menu. One must follow on-screen directions to complete the process. Feedback from the Department will be absent unless there are criminal records that would prevent license renewal. Applicants should wait approximately one month after submitting fingerprints before submitting their application. Fingerprint centers are located in Augusta, Auburn, Bangor, Portland, Presque Isle, and Springvale. The rate for this service is approximately \$55, set by the State Bureau of Investigation, and can only be paid via credit card. To change an appointment, visit the website link provided. For those without internet access, a phone number (1-855-667-7422) can be used to make an appointment. Appointments typically last around 15 minutes. Residents can use a paper fingerprint card if they are unable to be digitally printed; however, non-resident applicants must register and pay for a confirmation number prior to the process. To submit your application, follow these steps: First, visit (the Identogo Website) to create an account and schedule a fingerprint appointment. Then, print blank fingerprint cards from . After getting your fingerprints taken manually by a local police department or state police agency in your home state, mail the fingerprint cards to the address provided on the Identogo website. Fingerprints for non-law enforcement purposes aren't kept by the FBI or IFW. For CHRI requests related to non-law enforcement needs, federal law says a new record request must be made whenever a new authorized need comes up and fingerprints or other approved forms of ID must be submitted.
